
- 1. CHANGE: Concrete PSI changed from 4000 PSI to 3000 PSI
- 2. CLARIFY: Contractor to demolish existing metal fence at sidewalk leading to community building and cut off existing bolts at grade, drill out 1" of existing bolts and fill with color matching concrete epoxy.
- 3. DELETE: Scope of work 1. Project Summary #3. Contractor to provide and install metal posts at future driveway and pedestrian gate locations. Driveway and pedestrian gates to be installed by others. This section is deleted except for the gates that were included during the bid walk. 1 gate at the walkway leading to the community center and 1 gate at the greenbelt.
- 4. CHANGE: The fence style at the sidewalk leading to the community building is changed to a flat top to match existing fence (see exhibit 1 & 2.) The fence section at the green belt area to the south of the property to have the prongs at top of fence (see exhibit 1 & 2.)
- 5. CHANGE: The <u>WAGE RATES</u> have changed. See wage sheets (2 pages) included in this addendum.
- 6. CLARIFY: The steel fence panels attached to the chain link fencing to be 22ga PBR panels.
- 7. DELETE: The push bar, key/Fob pad and powered lock, expanded metal, powered opener/closer conduit part for the pedestrian access gate is not part of this contract and to be done by others.

- 8. CLARIFY: Contractor to install metal panel fencing at the chain link fencing so the overlap is at minimum per manufacturer recommendations. This will require 3 panels per chain link fence section. Existing panel fencing was installed top down and overlapped to meet design intent.
- 9. CLARIFY: KCHA will be responsible to cut back bushes 3 feet from each side of chain link fencing to allow contractor access to install metal panels.
- 10. ADD: Metal panel fence is 125LF on fencing plan page. Contractor to add 15 LF for a total of 140 LF of metal panel fencing.
- 11. CLARIFY: All details that refer to sheet #7 should be sheet #3. All detail that refer to sheet #8 should be sheet #4.
- 12. CHANGE: BID DUE LOCATION: The main entrance to the 600 building is closed for construction. All Bids will be accepted at the 700 building from 12 pm to 1 pm. (700 Andover Park West, Tukwila, WA 98188)
