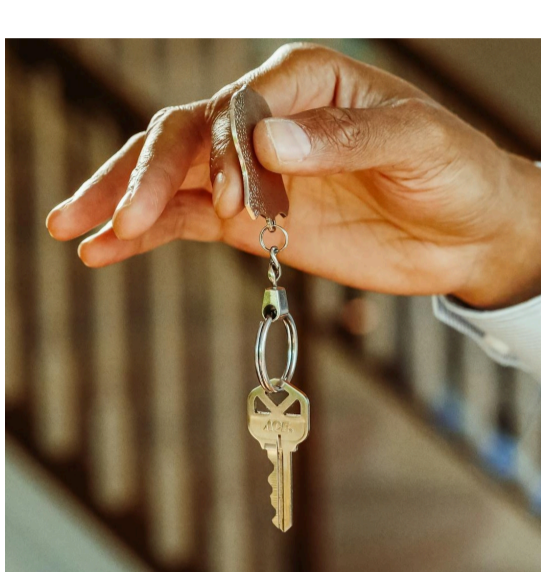

Renters' Rights Workshops



Join the King County Library and Solid Ground for Rent Smart workshops to know your rights and be prepared.

These online sessions cover important topics such as finding housing, landlord screening, information about barriers like credit and evictions, and how to get your deposit back.

For Immigrants and Refugees

The Northwest Immigrant Rights Project (NWIRP) has resources to help immigrants understand their rights when interacting with law enforcement and other officials. These resources include:

- **Know Your Rights Fliers.** Essential information on basic rights, such as the right to remain silent and the right to an attorney, available in English and Spanish.
- **National Immigration Law Center Pamphlet.** Basic rights that everyone has under the U.S. Constitution, available in English, Spanish, and Korean.
- **ACLU Know Your Rights Pamphlet.** A guide on what to do when stopped, questioned, arrested, or searched by law enforcement, available in English, Arabic, Urdu, Farsi, Hindi, Español and Français.
- **Workplace Raid Response Guides.** How to prepare for and respond to immigration enforcement actions at workplaces, available in English and Spanish.
- **Know Your Rights Presentations.** Educating community members about legal rights, covering topics like interactions with police and immigration officials.
- **Safety Plan for Youth and Children.** Helping families prepare for possible detention or deportation of parents with children, including children with or without documented status.

Most school districts have specialized choice schools that any student in the district can apply for. These choice schools may have a different style of teaching and learning, or focus more deeply on a specific subject.

[Choice schools](#) and [charter schools](#) are public schools and do not charge tuition.

Check your school district's website for information about what choice schools are available. **Applications for choice schools are usually due by the end of January.**
